






SPECIAL ECONOMIC ZONES

CLASS ACTION

| Name and the second sec | |

| Instrument type | group proceedings (commonly known as a class action) |
| Opt-in/Opt-out | opt-in |
| Scope of application (general/sectoral) | sectoral – limited to cases related to claims: for consumer protection, on the grounds of liability for a hazardous products, on the grounds of tort |
| Fundamental requirements to be met | a group of at least 10 persons homogeneity of the claims the same or similar factual basis of the claims standardization of the value of the claims (in the case of pecuniary claims) |
| Manner of group representation | representation principle |
| Type of granted legal protection | all available types of legal protection, including establishment of the defendant's liability |
| Costs of the proceedings | the losing party pays the costs |




COOPERATION WITH POLISH GOVERNMENT & PARLIAMENT
